Current activities include working to reduce incarceration of mentally ill and increasing resources for homeless populations.

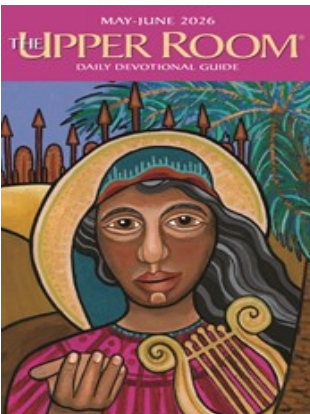
